SHMP Updates

- Probability matrix of all county hazard rankings
- Key For Hazard Summary Table
 - H- High Hazard Ranking (mapped in Red)
 - One or more occurrences each year
 - MH- Medium/High Hazard Ranking (mapped in Blue)
 - One occurrence every 3 years
 - M- Medium Hazard Ranking (mapped in Yellow)
 - One occurrence every 5-7 years
 - L- Low Hazard Ranking (mapped in Green)
 - One occurrence every 10 years
 - Not Identified (mapped in Tan)

- Goals & Objectives

HMGP Update

- NOFA's for Hurricane Hermine and Hurricane Matthew have been released (90-day estimate)
 - Hermine: \$6,783,319 million
 - Matthew: \$30,007,575 million
 - Total: nearly \$36.8 million
 - Almost \$9.2 million extra because of extra 5% in mitigation funds because of Enhanced SHMP
- HMGP Workshops are scheduled

Hurricane Loss Mitigation Program

RCMP has become HLMP

The Hurricane Loss Mitigation Program's strategic expansion of the scope of work has approved for the 2017-2018 grant cycle.

Types of applicable projects other than residential mitigation now include but are not limited to:

- Flood Venting
- Culvert construction
- Mitigation to government buildings, community centers, multi-unit homes, single family homes

Applicants know their communities and understand their own mitigation needs. The goal of the Program is to fill in gaps where local governments or non-profit partners find a shortfall in funding good mitigation projects. Applicants are encouraged to submit uniquely tailored mitigation projects that will do the most good for their community.



Hurricane Loss Mitigation Program

HLMP is only limited by any duplication of efforts.

Due to the availability of federal funding for the following activities, The Program cannot approve projects that include:

- Total demolition or building of a structure.
- Elevating a structure.
- Converting real property into perpetual greenspace.
- Retrofitting existing facilities used as a public shelter provided that those projects are funded by a FEMA grant or other HMGP funding.

Our hope that should the state eventually provide mitigation with more funding, that HLMP will have a diverse scope of work to help our state partners fund good mitigation projects that decrease risk to citizens of the State.
