Seek shelter inside an enclosed building



Residents & visitors should follow the tips below to stay safe while enjoying Florida's beaches.



(It's Day 2 of Severe Weather Awareness Week! Today's #FLSWAW focus is marine hazards & rip currents.

#DYK? Rip currents consistently rank at or near the top of the list of deadliest weather-related hazards, with Florida often leading the nation in reported rip current drownings each year.

Wednesday, February 5: Thunderstorms & Tornadoes

At approximately 10:00 a.m. EST, the National Weather Service will issue a practice Tornado Warning. The Warning will be broadcast on NOAA Alert Radio as a "routine weekly test" message. For the Florida Panhandle counties within the Central time zone, all drill activities will be repeated one hour earlier (9:00 a.m. CST).

This drill is voluntary. School districts, private schools, preschools and daycare centers are encouraged to participate in the drill. On the morning of the drill, all participants should consider themselves under a Tornado Watch. A Watch means you should monitor the weather and be prepared to go to a safe place in the event of a Warning.

Copy to post to Social Media Channels early in the morning before the alert goes out:


Day 3 of Severe Weather Awareness Week!

THUNDERSTORMS & TORNADOES KNOW THE SIGNS OF A TORNADO:


- Strong, consistent rotation in a cloud base
- Loud, continuous roar or rumble that doesn't fade quickly like thunder
- Whirling dust or debris on the ground under a cloud base


