# DRIVE-THRU TESTING FOR COVID-19 AT A STATE-SUPPORTED SITE

Anyone over the age of 18 can be tested, regardless of symptoms

### WHAT DO I NEED IN ORDER TO BE TESTED?

- Government Issued ID This photo ID does not need to be a Florida Drivers License
- Health Insurance Card Everyone will be tested, regardless if they have insurance
- Healthcare facility or first responder ID or badge (If applicable)

#### WHAT HAPPENS WHEN I ARRIVE AT THE TESTING SITE?

- Each vehicle will be greeted and directed by personnel in protective gear.
- Each individual will be asked to provide their government issued ID, first and last name, health insurance card and contact information

## WHAT IS THE TESTING PROCESS?

- A health professional in personal protective equipment will provide you with instructions.
- A soft swab will be inserted into your nose or throat, depending on the testing location, to get the necessary sample. This may be slightly uncomfortable; however, the test is quick and should take less than a minute.

# WHAT HAPPENS AFTER I AM TESTED?

- After you have been tested, you will move to the final station.
- You will be given information on what to do while awaiting test results. Please keep the instruction sheet until after you receive your results.
- Follow signage and directions for exiting the testing site.
- After being tested, continue to monitor and record symptoms. You will receive your test results via telephone call.

#### WHAT ELSE DO I NEED TO KNOW?

- There are no bathrooms at the testing sites. Each person who needs to be tested must be seated next to a working window.
- All passengers must stay inside vehicles from arrival to departure.
- Try to limit individuals in your vehicle to only those who need to be tested, no more than 5 in a vehicle.
- There may be significant wait times Prepare by having a full tank of gas and make sure the vehicle has working AC
